MAKE YOUR UC MONEY WORK SMARTER

Choosing to study abroad is a significant investment in your future, and UCEAP is committed to helping make it financially possible. On average, a year abroad costs about the same as a year on your home campus. Some programs are even cheaper than staying at UC!

- You can use your existing loans, grants, and scholarships to pay for a UCEAP program.
- Pay UC tuition while abroad with UCEAP. You don't pay host university tuition.
- Our cost estimates include everything from round-trip airfare to travel insurance, meals, and housing costs, so you can realistically budget to study abroad.
- UCEAP works directly with your campus financial aid office, which will repackage the aid you're eligible to receive and apply it to your study abroad program.

Scholarships

Hundreds of UC students receive UCEAP scholarships from **\$500 to \$8,000** each year. All UCEAP applicants are eligible to apply for our scholarships, including non-resident and international students.

We also provide scholarship resources outside of UCEAP awards to help make your program more affordable.

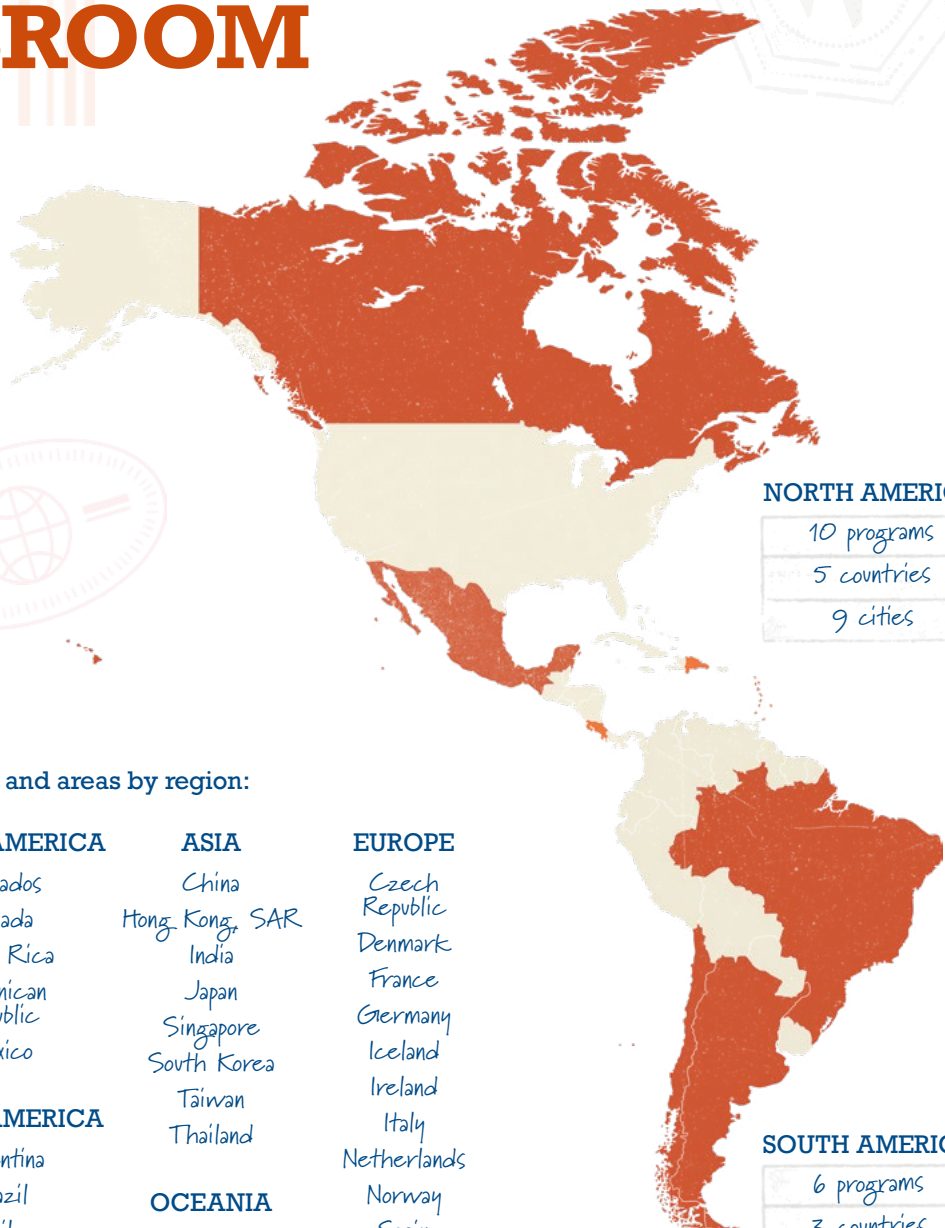
Follow these tips for the most successful scholarship applications:

1. **Start early:** Many scholarship deadlines are six months to a year in advance. That means if you want to study abroad in the spring, you will start submitting scholarship applications in late summer the year prior. Mind the deadlines!
2. **Ask for help:** Use the resources you have available, including your campus study abroad office, academic advisors, writing centers, and scholarship office.
3. **Get personal:** Scholarship reviewers award applicants who inspire a personal connection.
4. **Proofread and revise:** Follow the application instructions carefully, and ask advisors, faculty, or writing center staff to proofread your application and provide feedback.
5. **Apply widely:** Apply to as many scholarships as you can. Small amounts add up quickly.

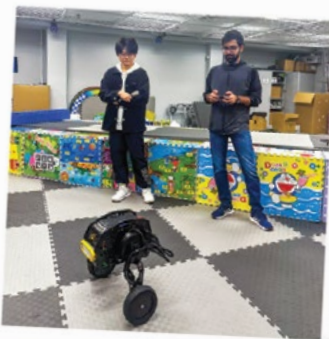

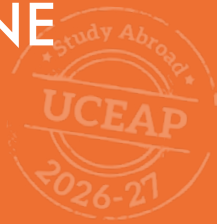
